"Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy" (1 Corinthians 4:2, NRSVue).

Clerk's report: Membership as of June 30, 2025: 121, Average Attendance in June: 86. Average Attendance in July: 98.

Here are our approved items:

- Tree New Mexico will donate two trees to St. Andrew, a pine tree and a New Mexico olive. Planting is planned for August 23.
- We approved becoming an Earth Care member congregation, which is a denominational initiative. We are already doing much of what is requested of member congregations. Moved seconded approved.
- The nominating committee is having difficulty identifying an adult education elder for the coming year. We are hoping to find an Elder for this position, but will form an Ad Hoc Committee to continue our Adult Education activities.
- We are working towards our committees meeting together to discuss their complementary functions to provide better communication and open possibilities for St. Andrew
- There was no Session meeting in August. Thanks to Bill Miller for taking the minutes for the July meeting.

**Treasurer's Report:** The June report reflects an anticipated summer decrease in income, but overall, we remain with a positive balance for the year.

Here is an article concerning a letter from the UCC General Council entitled "Religion is Next." An excerpt from the letter and article is in the link below. Also at the end are some inspiration poems, including one written by Walter Bruegemann, recently deceased.

Below is a portion of the excerpt of the letter concerning the new terms and conditions for the Nonprofit Security Grant Program now required of the recipients and subrecipients of the funding. I would like to point out that recipients are not to engage in DEI, DEIA, or 'discriminatory equity ideology' within the meaning of the Executive Order.

First: the A in DEIA stands for Accessibility! Does that mean the church recipients must get rid of their ramps?

Second: "discriminatory equity" is an oxymoron at best and is rendered meaningless by the words attempting to describe a nonexistent concept. (My Opinion).

Any church seeking funding from the Nonprofit Security Grant Program needs to read the terms and conditions carefully!

The terms and conditions for the Nonprofit Security Grant Program now require recipients and subrecipients of the funding, among other things:

- to cooperate with immigration officials,
- · not engage in or promote programs that engage in DEI, DEIA, or 'discriminatory equity ideology' within the meaning of the Executive Order, in violation of anti-discrimination laws, and
- not participate in discriminatory prohibited boycotts relating to Israel.

HHS is also requiring certification of compliance with not engaging in DEI activity.
